Regarding which nurse was assigned to Lisa Shore, the morning of October 22, 1998:

It is Ms Campbell's understanding that Sian Phillibert, RN, was originally assigned to the care of Lisa Shore on the morning of October 22, 1998. However, there had been a sick call from a nurse who had probably been assigned as RP (resource person or charge person) for that shift. As a result, Ms Phillibert was moved to the RP position, and Marta Papa, RN, was assigned to Lisa Shore.

Regarding the Patient Care Summary printed for Lisa Shore on the morning of October 22, 1998:

The Patient Care Summary for each of the patients automatically prints every 12 hours at approximately 0615 and 1825 hours. The Summary is used as a work sheet for the nurses, and is discarded at the end of their shift. It is not part of the permanent record. A copy of the Patient Care Summary printed for Lisa on this morning was enclosed in the letter of February 1, 1999, sent to the Coroner's Office by Lynne Turner, Director of Health Records at HSC.

Regarding the status of the taped report from the night shift of October 21-22, 1998 for Unit 5A:

According to Ms Campbell, no one thought about the taped report at the time of Lisa's death. This report was taped over, and is no longer available.

How temperatures were measured on Unit 5A in October 1998:

Ms Campbell explained that temperatures (by mouth or by auxilla) were taken with the use of a IVAC electronic thermometer. Thermometers which are used on the ear were not used and continue to not be used on the units.

Use of an oximeter with Lisa Shore, night shift of October 21-22, 1998:

It is Ms Campbell's understanding from evidence given at the inquest that an oximeter which measures the saturation of oxygen in the blood was not used in Lisa Shore's care.
